Scripture Reading – Colossians 3:1-14

If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. ² Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. ³ For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. ⁴ When Christ who is your life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory.

⁵ Put to death therefore what is earthly in you: sexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. ⁶ On account of these the wrath of God is coming. ⁷ In these you too once walked, when you were living in them. ⁸ But now you must put them all away: anger, wrath, malice, slander, and obscene talk from your mouth. ⁹ Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have put off the old self with its practices ¹⁰ and have put on the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge after the image of its creator. ¹¹ Here there is not Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave, free; but Christ is all, and in all.

¹² Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience, ¹³ bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. ¹⁴ And above all these put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony.

- Planetarium Visit: You are invited to the Planetarium at the York Learning Center on Fri. June 3 for a free evening of learning about the heavens. We will hear two programs: a live presentation on the stars in the June night sky, and a recorded presentation "Back to the Moon for Good", with live updates on upcoming Moon projects. Both presentations are by Todd Ullery, Member of the York County Astronomical Society and a NASA Ambassador (volunteer). Go to 301 East 6th Avenue, York, and follow the signs to the Planetarium. *Arrive no later than 6:15* for a 6:30 start time, as it is customary at Planetariums to lock the outside doors so that the viewing experience is not interrupted by late arrivals. There will be a break between the two programs. The event should conclude by about 8 pm. There is room for 60, and this is an event for New Life and our invited guests. - Men's Event Gettysburg Battlefield Tour June 25: Our Gettysburg experience will begin with a visit to the Museum to see nationally renowned exhibits, the "Cyclorama" painting, and a 15-minute film. Our guide, Bob Steenstra highly recommends this as a preliminary to the tour. Bob's tour of the Battlefield will be about 2 hours, with a group fee, ranging from \$31.50 per hour to \$66 per hour, depending on the number of people in the group. The total group price will be divided among the participants. So, if 7-15 people attend, the group fee will be \$83.00 divided by the number of attendees. If 10 people attend, the individual cost will be \$8.30. Iren Snavely and Rob Rothermel are coordinating the trip.
