
Call to Worship – Psalm 40 and 41



Scripture – Judges 9:7-21

⁷ When it was told to Jotham, he went and stood on top of Mount Gerizim and cried aloud and said to them, "Listen to me, you leaders of Shechem, that God may listen to you. ⁸ The trees once went out to anoint a king over them, and they said to the olive tree, 'Reign over us.' ⁹ But the olive tree said to them, 'Shall I leave my abundance, by which gods and men are honored, and go hold sway over the trees?' ¹⁰ And the trees said to the fig tree, 'You come and reign over us.' ¹¹ But the fig tree said to them, 'Shall I leave my sweetness and my good fruit and go hold sway over the trees?' ¹² And the trees said to the vine, 'You come and reign over us.' ¹³ But the vine said to them, 'Shall I leave my wine that cheers God and men and go hold sway over the trees?' ¹⁴ Then all the trees said to the bramble, 'You come and reign over us.' ¹⁵ And the bramble said to the trees, 'If in good faith you are anointing me king over you, then come and take refuge in my shade, but if not, let fire come out of the bramble and devour the cedars of Lebanon.'

¹⁶ "Now therefore, if you acted in good faith and integrity when you made Abimelech king, and if you have dealt well with Jerubbaal and his house and have done to him as his deeds deserved—¹⁷ for my father fought for you and risked his life and delivered you from the hand of Midian, ¹⁸ and you have risen up against my father's house this day and have killed his sons, seventy men on one stone, and have made Abimelech, the son of his female servant, king over the leaders of Shechem, because he is your relative—¹⁹ if you then have acted in good faith and integrity with Jerubbaal and with his house this day, then rejoice in Abimelech, and let him also rejoice in you. ²⁰ But if not, let fire come out from Abimelech and devour the leaders of Shechem and Beth-millo; and let fire come out from the leaders of Shechem and from Bethmillo and devour Abimelech." ²¹ And Jotham ran away and fled and went to Beer and lived there, because of Abimelech his brother.

- **Fall Directory:** In preparation for our new pictorial directory, please review the current directory in the foyer and make any necessary changes or additions. You can also email any updates to kelly@newlifeyorkpca.com.
- New Adult Education Class: Currently, there is a Bible study of the book of 1 Corinthians. Starting on Nov. 13, a second adult class will begin. This 4-week Sunday School class at 9am Sundays will examine a committee report written by the PCA on the topic of "Human Sexuality." We will cover the following topics: a summary list of theological commitments that frame the issue; an overview of the teachings of the confessions of the church; an examination of biblical perspectives for pastoral care; an analysis of apologetic approaches for speaking in the world.

- Operation Christmas Child: Please consider filling a Christmas gift shoebox with appropriate gifts and toys for a child in another country. Boxes come with packing ideas and can be picked up from the foyer. Printing your labels and paying online is strongly recommended especially since you can track your box that way. Otherwise, brochures are available with labels and envelopes attached in order to send your shipping donation of \$10 per box by mail. (Do not place checks inside boxes or affix to the outside). Boxes are due back to New Life no later than Sun. Nov. 13. See Connie Kay with questions.
- **Pancake Lunch:** Due to the wild success of the previous one, pancake lunch returns for 2nd Sunday lunch on Nov. 13! On this Sunday, please bring along breakfast side-dishes to share.
- Officer Nominations: The session requests that the congregation prayerfully consider and nominate men for the office of elder and/or deacon. The session believes it would be wise for New Life to have two more elders and two more deacons, although the final decision in this regard belongs to the congregation. Please pick up a nomination form and the pamphlet which explains the whole process. Nominations will be received until Dec. 4.
- Giving Need for the Building Improvement Fund: New Life hopes to fundraise and finish several building improvement projects this year. The projects include: classroom wall removal and ceiling replacement; a level, fenced play area in the yard for children/youth; replacement of the external sanctuary door; and a redesign/replacement of the external fellowship hall door. The redesigned door will include a transom to allow natural light into the fellowship hall, as well as an ADA compliant paved sidewalk out to the road. The cost of all these changes is \$27,000. The Building Improvement Fund has a current balance of \$7,318.57. The ministry moment quarterly financial report on 10/30 will include sharing reasons why the session is asking for donations to this fund rather than utilizing our current YTD giving surplus. As you prayerfully consider the ways in which you feel led to give, please consider designated giving to this fund.
