The Advent wreath is a circle with no beginning and no end. It is a symbol of endless love and faithfulness. Out of darkness light shines, pointing us in hope to the One who came to overcome the darkness of this world and to be our light in the world to come.

Three weeks ago we lit the Prophecy candle and remembered those who first spoke the promise of the coming Christ child.

Two weeks ago we lit the Bethlehem candle, a symbol of the preparations being made to receive and cradle the Christ child.

Last week we lit the Shepherds' candle, remembering the first in a long line of people who joyfully shared the good news of the Savior's birth.

The fourth candle on the Advent wreath is called the Angels' candle. It reminds us of the hope fulfilled in the first coming of our Savior and of our continuing hope as we anticipate his coming again.

[Light all 4 candles]

Reader: Psalm 24 extols God as the great Lord who founded the earth and whose victorious rule governs history. The earth is the Lord's. He is the King of glory.

- **Christmas Changes:** Our Christmas Eve "Lessons and Carols" service will be at 7pm. There will be no Sunday School or snack after worship on Dec. 25 or Jan. 1.
- Nursery: The nursery will not be staffed on Dec. 25 or Jan. 1. Parents are still welcome
 to use the nursery as needed during those services.
- New Adult Sunday School Class: Starting Jan. 8, Wayne Blanding will teach a class on Finances and the Bible. The study of 1 Corinthians will also resume that day.
- Youth Group Parents Meeting: After the second Sunday lunch on Jan 8th, there will be a meeting for parents of youth group aged children (grades 6-12). The purpose of the meeting will be to discuss ways that the church can grow in discipling the next generation.

- Congregational Meeting: Mark your calendars for Jan. 15 for NLPC's annual congregational meeting. We will look back at 2022, look forward to 2023, discuss the 2023 budget, and hold a congregational vote on a proposed salary change for Pastor Erik.
- Ladies of New Life and Friends: Winter book: Where the Light Fell by Philip Yancey. Discussion and dinner to be announced for late February.
- Giving Need for the Building Improvement Fund: New Life hopes to fundraise and finish several building improvement projects this year. These include: classroom wall removal and ceiling replacement; a level, fenced play area in the yard for children/youth; replacement of the external sanctuary door; and a redesign/replacement of the external fellowship hall door. The redesigned door will include a transom to allow natural light into the fellowship hall, as well as an ADA compliant paved sidewalk out to the asphalt driveway. The cost of all these changes is \$27,000. The Building Improvement Fund has a current balance of \$14,068.57. Although we have a current YTD giving surplus, there are some expenses that NLPC has incurred that are not in the 2022 budget (50 new chairs, the new piano, etc.). Further, the elders think that the capital reserve fund for major upkeep of the existing property like a new roof or new HVAC units is very underfunded. Any undesignated budget surplus from 2022 will be allocated to the capital reserve fund. As you prayerfully consider the ways in which you feel led to give, please consider designated giving to the building improvement fund.
