

Announcements

- Christmas Changes: There will be no Sunday School or snack after worship on Dec. 25 or Jan. 1.
- **Nursery:** The nursery will not be staffed on Dec. 25 or Jan. 1. Parents are still welcome to use the nursery to stay with their children as needed during those services.
- A New Adult Sunday School Class: Starting Jan. 8, Wayne Blanding will teach a class on Finances and the Bible. The study of 1 Corinthians will also resume that day.
- Youth Group Parents' Meeting: After the second Sunday lunch on Jan. 8, there will be a meeting for parents of youth group aged children (grades 6-12). The purpose is to discuss ways that the church can grow in discipling the next generation.
- Congregational Meeting: Mark your calendars for Jan. 15 for NLPC's annual congregational meeting. We will look back at 2022 and forward to 2023. We will discuss the 2023 budget and hold a congregational vote on a proposed salary change for Pastor Erik.
- Women's Book club: Women of New Life and their friends are reading Where the Light Fell by Philip Yancey. Discussion and dinner to be announced for late February.

- Online Giving: The donation portal for online giving to New Life is changing. Online donations will still be made to the PCA Foundation and forwarded to New Life on a weekly basis. The new portal accepts both credit card and bank debit transactions. Additionally, the portal will provide the donor the option of supporting processing charges, called "Complete Cover". The donor can select to cover anywhere from 5% (default) to 0% of the donated amount as an additional processing fee. For example, if a donor intends to donate \$100 to New Life and selects a 5% cover, then the donor will be charged \$105, and \$100 will be given to New Life. If the donor selects a 0% cover, then the donor will be charged \$100 and \$100 will be given to New Life.
- Giving Need for the Building Improvement Fund: New Life hopes to fundraise and finish several building improvement projects in the coming year. These include: classroom wall removal and ceiling replacement; a level, fenced play area in the yard for children/youth; replacement of the external sanctuary door; and a redesign/replacement of the external fellowship hall door. The redesigned door will include a transom to allow natural light into the fellowship hall, as well as an ADA compliant paved sidewalk out to the asphalt driveway. The cost of all these changes is \$27,000. The Building Improvement Fund has a current balance of \$15,068.57. Although we have a current YTD giving surplus, there are some expenses that NLPC has incurred that are not in the 2022 budget (50 new chairs, the new piano, etc.). Further, the elders think that the capital reserve fund for major upkeep of the existing property like a new roof or new HVAC units is very underfunded. Any undesignated budget surplus from 2022 will be allocated to the capital reserve fund. As you prayerfully consider the ways in which you feel led to give, please consider designated giving to the building improvement fund.
