

#### Scripture – 1 Samuel 18:1-16 (Context: 1 Samuel 18-21)

As soon as he had finished speaking to Saul, the soul of Jonathan was knit to the soul of David, and Jonathan loved him as his own soul. <sup>2</sup> And Saul took him that day and would not let him return to his father's house. <sup>3</sup> Then Jonathan made a covenant with David, because he loved him as his own soul. <sup>4</sup> And Jonathan stripped himself of the robe that was on him and gave it to David, and his armor, and even his sword and his bow and his belt. <sup>5</sup> And David went out and was successful wherever Saul sent him, so that Saul set him over the men of war. And this was good in the sight of all the people and also in the sight of Saul's servants.

<sup>6</sup> As they were coming home, when David returned from striking down the Philistine, the women came out of all the cities of Israel, singing and dancing, to meet King Saul, with tambourines, with songs of joy, and with musical instruments. <sup>7</sup> And the women sang to one another as they celebrated,

"Saul has struck down his thousands,

and David his ten thousands."

<sup>8</sup> And Saul was very angry, and this saying displeased him. He said, "They have ascribed to David ten thousands, and to me they have ascribed thousands, and what more can he have but the kingdom?" <sup>9</sup> And Saul eyed David from that day on.

<sup>10</sup> The next day a harmful spirit from God rushed upon Saul, and he raved within his house while David was playing the lyre, as he did day by day. Saul had his spear in his hand. <sup>11</sup> And Saul hurled the spear, for he thought, "I will pin David to the wall." But David evaded him twice.

<sup>12</sup> Saul was afraid of David because the LORD was with him but had departed from Saul. <sup>13</sup> So Saul removed him from his presence and made him a commander of a thousand. And he went out and came in before the people. <sup>14</sup> And David had success in all his undertakings, for the LORD was with him. <sup>15</sup> And when Saul saw that he had great success, he stood in fearful awe of him. <sup>16</sup> But all Israel and Judah loved David, for he went out and came in before them.

### Susquehanna Valley Presbytery Growth Report to SVP Congregations

At the end of 2018, which was soon after the closure of 2 failed church planting efforts, SVP adopted a "7-Year Church Planting Plan." The goal set in the Plan was to have 25 churches by the end of 2025. At that time there were 20 congregations in the presbytery. A 25% increase in 7 years is quite a challenge.

Four years into the Plan we have seen the addition of 3 churches added by 3 different means.

- Lebanon Valley Presbyterian Church was a "scratch plant" under the leadership of Francisco (Cisco) Victa and 4 elders appointed by Presbytery. They began worship services in the face of the Covid pandemic.
- Christ Reformed Church is a "transfer church" that came out of the UCC denomination. It is a small congregation in Huntingdon County led by Pastor Angelo Valle and under the guidance of elders from our church in State College.
- Bellefonte Presbyterian Church is a "daughter church" of Oakwood PCA in State College and being led by Owen Hughes the Associate Pastor at Oakwood. Oakwood bought a disused Presbyterian (USA) building for this plant.

Pray with us for:

- The leaders of the 3 current "Mission Churches."
- The financial resources necessary to carry these churches to maturity.
- That the Presbytery may be guided to churches that may be struggling and wish to transfer into SVP.
- That the right man and the money may become available to do another plant from scratch.
- That other churches in the Presbytery may be able to plant daughter churches.

By the grace of God our goal is within reach. That means the 3 present Mission Church must continue to grow and 2 more churches need to be added to the Susquehanna Valley Presbytery.
