Reader: As we prepare our hearts for the coming of our Lord, we prepare our homes for the arrival of family and friends. We imagine what it will be like to sit and dine and visit with loved ones. We treasure thoughts of home when home is safe and loving.

Child: Home is a great place to be at Christmas. I can't wait to open gifts, eat with family and friends and have fun. Home is the best place to be this time of year.

Reader: Mary and Joseph had to leave home, just when they needed home the most. Their difficult journey to Bethlehem meant they were alone at a time when they most needed community. Yet God was present to Mary and Joseph in their wandering. They experienced God as protector and sustainer, even as they traveled from their home to the unfamiliarity of Bethlehem for the census. Once there, they experienced God as keeper of promises.

Lighting of the Candle

Reader: Jeremiah says: 'The days are coming,' declares the LORD, 'when I will fulfill the gracious promise I made to the house of Israel and to the house of Judah. In those days and at that time I will make a righteous Branch sprout from David's line; he will do what is just and right in the land. In those days Judah will be saved and Jerusalem will live in safety. This is the name by which it will be called: The LORD Our Righteousness." [Jeremiah 33:14-16]

Congregational Prayer: Dear God, You are our heart's home. Your home is safe, loving, and eternal. But, so many of your children are trapped in homes that are not safe. Or they are forced to leave homes that are — for nightmares they barely escape. You chose to incarnate yourself into a family that had little else but love on the night you were born. Rescue us from the danger of being obsessed with ourselves so that we can see the needs, and the hope, around us. Forgive us for not finding our security in you. Forgive us for failing to show your love to others. Draw us closer to your light as we draw closer to Christmas. In Jesus' name we pray, Amen.
