Reader: During Christmas, surrounded by family and friends, we feel the warmth of knowing we belong in this place, with these people. Or, we feel the jarring disappointment that can come when we sense we do not.

Child: When it is Christmas and family and friends are around, I feel I belong somewhere special. But I know that not everyone feels that way this time of year.

Reader: This season is a time of highs and lows, of joy and depression, of rushing when we want to stand still. Within the Christmas story itself, we find opposites. Angels, heaven's glorious citizens, mix and mingle with shepherds, Bethlehem's least. The God who chose an unwed mother and who was born in a barn uses shepherds, the outcasts of the day, to be the first to hear the news that Immanuel has come.

Lighting of the Candles

Reader: Paul tells us: "But God chose the foolish things of the world to shame the wise; God chose the weak things of the world to shame the strong. God chose the lowly things of this world and the despised things—and the things that are not—to nullify the things that are, so that no one may boast before him. It is because of him that you are in Christ Jesus, who has become for us wisdom from God—that is, our righteousness, holiness and redemption. Therefore, as it is written: "Let the one who boasts boast in the Lord." [I Corinthians 1:27-31)

Congregational Prayer: Dear God, You are the light of the world. In you, there is no darkness at all. There are no outcasts, no one who is not good enough. Forgive us for believing, if only for a moment, that we had to be good enough for your love. Forgive us for failing to walk in the light. Renew us, we pray. In Jesus' name, amen.



- London Evangelism and Prayer (LEAP): Please prayerfully consider whether you are interested in potentially participating in a short-term mission trip to London in the summer of 2024. The trip is titled; "London Evangelism and Prayer," and it will occur from July 1 through July 8. The mission organization New Life is partnering with, Serge, is ministering to the East Asian community (Indians, Pakistanis, etc.) who reside in London. Approximately 1/3 of the time is spent learning about other religions and how to share the gospel, 1/3 of the time is spent in direct evangelism street evangelism and door-to-door evangelism, and 1/3 of the time is spent in prayer. We currently have 2 people from NLPC registered to participate, and we will be partnering with Wheatland PCA in Lancaster. NLPC attenders to LEAP will do their own fundraising as a group, and NLPC attenders will join with Wheatland for ministry preparation and travel.
